Due to the ongoing COVID- 19 pandemic we have had to change the way we carry out some of our careers activities this year.

Mock interviews will now be conducted virtually. Students will be interviewed online over MS Teams by local employers. The interviews will allow students to practise and develop vital interview skills and can use this experience as a chance to be more prepared for real sixth form/ college/ apprenticeship/ job interviews in the near future.

We are currently working on a virtual work experience offer for the summer term. We understand that a virtual offer may work well for some students as it gives insight and experience of national companies that they may not have had the chance to access previously. However, the virtual offer may not work for others so we highly encourage students to gain real work experience during the school holidays or weekends through voluntary work, placements or part time employment, COVID restrictions permitting.

their PSHE lessons introducing them to <u>Careerpilot</u>, a free online platform offering a wealth of impartial information about jobs, courses & qualifications. It helps students identify their GCSE, post-16 and post-18 options. These one hour workshops will focus on job sectors and

employability skills making the link between Higher Education and industry, exploring entry requirements and pathways, including higher and degree apprenticeships.
