## **Curriculum** Update

At TCS our curriculum is designed to inspire and challenge, enabling all students to become the best version of themselves. Each half term we will be sharing a curriculum update newsletter with you which aims to provide an insight into what our students will be learning about in the classroom. Our newsletter will serve as a bridge between the classroom and home, and we hope that this will enable you to continue conversations that students have begun in the classroom to deepen and extend their learning. A strong partnership between school and home significantly contributes to a child's academic progress helping them to develop and grow.



This year we have made some changes to our curriculum so that it better meets the needs of our young people. Students in Year 7 to 9 now all follow the same diet of lessons ensuring that we can cover the curriculum in more depth and create more meaningful learning opportunities.

In particular, we have increased the number of hours that students study Science as this subject provides the foundation for understanding the world around us. Early exposure to science also helps to increase students' awareness of a diverse range of career options which they may choose to follow in the future.

We have also made the decision that students in Key Stage 3 will now only study one modern foreign language (assigned on entry to TCS) instead of two as had historically been the case. This will enable students to make more significant progress in one area rather than spreading their efforts too thinly and trying to grasp the nuances of two languages.

Having used Sparx Maths as part of our home learning approach for a number of years we have now invested fully into the Sparx Classroom programme, equipping all of our maths classrooms which Chrome Books so that students can work at their own pace through the maths curriculum. Personalised algorithms support and challenge all students to join in and push themselves to do their best. We are really excited to see the impact this has on our students'

In Key Stage 4 we have removed our pathways approach and all students now have the opportunity to indicate their subject preferences from the whole suite of available options.

We have been fortunate to have been joined by new staff in our Business and Catering departments and they are busy writing new curriculums in these areas. We are looking forward to how these develop over the next few months.

All of our Year 11 students now have a weekly writing tutorial on a Friday morning during lesson time to upskill their knowledge for the English Language paper and practise applying these exam skills. After half term there will also be an opportunity to join a weekly enrichment seminar for English after school on a Monday.

Students in Key Stage 5 continue to follow varied and personalised curriculums. We are absolutely delighted to be able to offer A Level Chemistry again and are looking forward to developing our scientific community at TCS. Likewise, our E Sports curriculum continues to grow and we now have students following both L2 and L3 courses in this area which is an exciting new venture for us. For those students with a passion for languages we now also provide an opportunity to work towards an international DELE course in Spanish so that they can continue to deepen their understanding of a language alongside their other subjects.
